

Faroes will deliver a lightweight Web 2.0 style repository that allows teachers to easily share their resources. The goal is to begin to explore the difficult issues of *authorship*, *provenance*, *authority* and *copyright* in the context of a real system with real users.

Faroes\* is the follow on project to Claret; both projects are based on the Clare repository (a version of ePrints) and both have worked with the language teaching community in the UK.

## Faroes will:

- create a lightweight, simple repository that replicates the best-practice openness and user experience seen in commercial Web 2.0 sites such as Flickr or YouTube.
- engage with the language teaching community to support them in creating and sharing their digital resources.
- develop technologies to create a single searchable space over several repositories
- explore how tags might evolve into folksonomies to aid in navigation
- investigate how structured feedback might support learning resources over a lifetime of shared usage
